

RoHs III Certificate of Compliance Directive (EU) 2015/863 Restriction of Hazardous Substances

Bay Motor Products, Inc hereby declares and certifies that our products are compliant to RoHS II Directive (Directive 2011/65/EU) and the definitions given for the Directive (EU) 2015/863 by the commission on the restriction of the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment.

Bay Motor Products, Inc further states, our products are RoHS III compliant to the latest directive effective December 31, 2016 and published as directive (EU) 2015/863. This new directive adds 4 Phthalates onto the original six hazardous substances (shown below); and that there are no RoHS exemptions. These additional restricted Phthalates will come into force on July 22nd, 2019 for all electrical and electronic equipment.

This directive provides guidelines to restrict the use of hazardous substances in the material composition of the components within our products. Based on certifications received form our supply sources, Bay Motor Products, Inc. hereby states that following banned substances are not found above the threshold level listed other than exceptions approved by the European Commission.
